RE: Less-Than-Fair-Value Investigation of Certain Aluminum Extrusions from Türkiye

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

On May 2, 2024, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced the preliminary determination in the less-than-fair-value investigation of certain aluminum extrusions from Türkiye. As of May 3, 2024, all of the relevant calculations pertaining to the preliminary determination have been released. In accordance with 19 CFR 351.224(c)(2), all parties will have five calendar days to review these materials and provide comments on any significant ministerial errors found in our preliminary calculations.¹ Accordingly, comments must be submitted in writing to Commerce by **5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on Wednesday, May 8, 2024.**

¹ 19 CFR 351.224(g) defines “significant ministerial error” as the correction of which, either singly or in combination with other errors: (1) Would result in a change of at least five absolute percentage points in, but not less than 25 percent of, the weighted-average dumping margin calculated in the original (erroneous) preliminary determination; or (2) Would result in a difference between a weighted-average dumping margin of zero (or de minimis) and a weighted-average dumping margin rate of greater than de minimis, or vice versa. Section 735(e) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, defines the term “ministerial error” to include “errors in addition, subtraction, or other arithmetic function, clerical errors resulting from inaccurate copying, duplication, or the like, and any other type of unintentional error which the administering authority considers ministerial.”
